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A. Introduction

The purpose of this report is to document conformance with the requirements of the LegalSource standard by Danzer UK Ltd hereafter referred to as "Organisation". The report presents findings of LegalSource auditors, who have evaluated the Organisation's systems and performance against the applicable requirements. The sections below provide the audit conclusions and follow-up actions required by the Organisation.

Description of Organisation:	<p>Danzer UK Ltd, part of Danzer Group, is solely a trading company, with no production taking place. Danzer UK sales can be divided between sawn timber and added-value products (manufactured products such as worktops, flooring and mouldings). Most added-value products are single-species products, although the Organisation is beginning to work more with composite products such as engineered flooring and doors.</p> <p>In principle Danzer UK is a multi-site Organisation since storage takes place in separate locations, however no processing takes place, the material is simply stored. Multi-site requirements are therefore handled via the chain of custody system.</p> <p>Danzer UK is located in one office location in Maldon, Essex. Warehoused products are usually stored at an outsourced facility in Liverpool (Denholm Handling Ltd) or Maldon (D.W. Clarks & Sons Ltd). There are two other storage facilities in the UK. There is also a storage and drying facility located in the Netherlands within the scope of the certificate.</p> <p>Danzer UK acts as a trader (taking legal possession) in 99% of its trading activity. For the other 1% it is acting as an agent (arranging purchases/sales and charging a commission, without taking legal possession). At the present time, Danzer UK imports from all continents except South America. Approximately 25% of its purchases are from within the Danzer group.</p> <p>The vast majority of products sourced from outside of Europe/ United States is purchased as certified (FSC 100%, FSC CW, PEFC) or under a private or public legality assurance verification (SVLK, OLB, MYTLAS, RA VLC).</p>

Description of Observation:	
<p>The Organisation's procedures cover all applicable standard requirements.</p> <p>As per last year's audit, it was noted that the Organisation is currently planning to simplify the procedures to better reflect the supply chains sourced from and different risk mitigation strategy (due to generally lower and less frequent risks) to those of other organisations in the Danzer group. The current procedures are in line with requirements and do not impact Danzer UK's ability to conduct due diligence as per standard requirements.</p> <p>Due to Covid-19 and related issues, the new set of procedures is not yet available, but already in an advanced state.</p> <p><i>In order to have an effective DDS system and to avoid confusion and materials with various versions it would be beneficial to have one clear and updated manual.</i></p>
